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Welcome to Father's Day Week at the It List, where we hope you'll find just the thing to honor Dear Old Dad. We're sure you never would have thought of these without us.

Fly It: Who needs another tie when you can give Dad a flying lesson instead? Visit www.pilotproject.org to find the flight school nearest you.

For most of us, that will be North Coast Flight School, which operates at Erie International/Tom Ridge Field. Call 836-9220 and ask for the flight school. Lessons there start at \$150 an hour, which covers plane rental, fuel and an instructor.

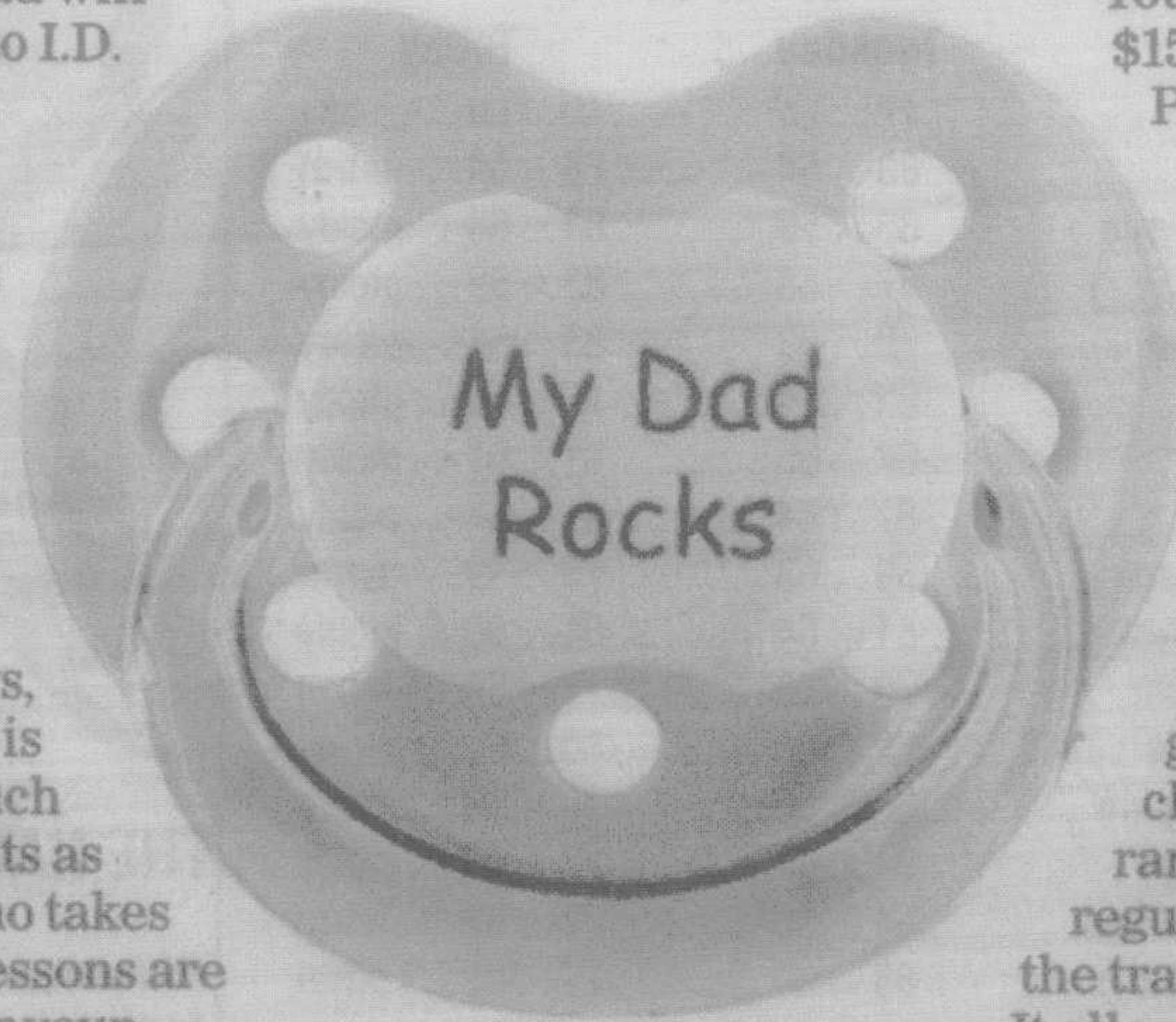
To get a license to fly by yourself, you need to clock a minimum of 40 hours of instruction. North Coast offers packages in 10-hour blocks, which offers \$5 off the plane rental, and 20-hour blocks, which offers 10 percent off plane rental.

Flight students should call and make reservations two to three days in

advance. Dad will need a photo I.D. such as a drivers license or passport, as well as a birth certificate.

Suck It: As any father knows, the pacifier is worth as much to the parents as the child who takes it. If flying lessons are a bit lofty for your budget, check out personalized pacifiers for baby that read 'Daddy's Girl' or 'My Dad Rocks.'
